We will likely need to rethink many things under C of E guidance in regards to sharing the chalice and the peace – but it is important for you all to know that you can make your choices about your personal space - and we will respect this. The generic use of crossed arms over the chest for a polite decline of something is a good, polite way for us to tell each other that we wish to be less tactile or we would prefer not to be too physically close.

We will stop the booklet deliveries following this Sunday and reinstate home communion for those who are housebound.

We are hopeful that as changes come to fruition we will see many of you back in church. We have missed many of you! As a church we have held ourselves together with such faith and strength — and we should be very proud of who and where we are. Let us pray that we will continue to grow and develop as we emerge fully to share faith, hope and love together in Hither Green.
